### **INVITATION**

Enterococci occur and grow in a variety of fermented foods. The presence of enterococci in food products has long been considered as an indication of poor sanitary conditions during production and processing. On the other hand, fermented foods containing enterococci have a long history of safe use. It is also claimed that enterococci play an important role in the development of the organoleptic properties of the fermented foods. Furthermore, many enterococcal strains have interesting biotechnological traits, such as bacteriocin production, and functional properties such as probiotic features.

The last few years however, this view is changing because of the increasing incidence of enterococci in nosocomial infections, and the widespread occurrence of antibiotic-resistant enterococci, especially in hospital environments. Many studies have consistently found vancomycin resistant enterococci in clinical human samples, in animal samples as well as in foods.

Over the past four years, the European Commission has funded the project "Enterococci in Food Fermentations. Functional and Safety Aspects" (FAIR-CT97-3078). The project generated new data on enterococci in respect to physiology, typing, taxonomy, as well as aspects of functionality, safety and technological performance. It seemed therefore timely to organize an International Symposium concerning the actual knowledge on enterococci in foods.

We cordially invite you to attend this Symposium, which is organized under the auspices of the Food and Agro-Industrial Research (FAIR) Programme of the European Commission, and hosted by the Federal Institute for Health Protection of Consumers and Veterinary Medicine (BgVV), Berlin. The Symposium aims to present the most recent developments on the functional and safety aspects on enterococci, by bringing together scientists, and R&D and production managers of food and pharmaceutical industries from all over the world.
